

NAME

`t1testpage` – create a PostScript proof for a Type 1 font

SYNOPSIS

t1testpage [*font*]

DESCRIPTION

T1testpage creates a PostScript proof document for the specified Type 1 font file and writes it to the standard output. The proof shows every glyph in the font, including its glyph name and encoding. The *font* argument should be the name of a PFA or PFB font file. If it is omitted, `t1testpage` will read a font file from the standard input.

`T1testpage` is preliminary software.

OPTIONS

-g *glyphs*, **--glyph=***glyphs*

Print only glyphs matching *glyphs*. The argument is a glyph pattern, using shell-like matching rules; thus, **-g** 'A*' will match the glyphs 'A', 'Atilde', and 'Ampersand', among others. You can give this option multiple times, or supply multiple space-separated patterns in a single option.

-s, **--smoke**

Print smoke proofs, one glyph per page. This option is preliminary.

-o *file*, **--output=***file*

Write the output proof to *file* instead of the standard output.

-h, **--help**

Print usage information and exit.

-v, **--version**

Print the version number and some short non-warranty information and exit.
